Vestry members serve a 3-year term. Any confirmed person who is regular in worship, is 18 years of age or older and has made and maintained a financial commitment to the parish in the previous year is eligible to serve on the vestry. Also, nominees should not be members of the same household as members of the search committee or the new vestry.

I'm pleased to report that Community Christmas of Oglethorpe County raised over \$70,000 in 2017, used to provide gifts of warm clothing, shoes, and fun items for 407 children from 168 families living in poverty in Oglethorpe County. The value of the gifts each child received was at least \$125. Additionally, a total of \$11,097 was supplied to 22 families for emergency grants for electricity, rent, and other essentials over the course of the year.

This project brings together hundreds of people representing many different churches, businesses, families, and organizations who all unite with the purpose of lifting up and restoring hope and dignity for impoverished local children.

Thank you so much to the congregation of St. Gregory the Great Episcopal Church for donating and volunteering with this effort this year, as you have since Community Christmas was formed 21 years ago!

A special thank-you also to Missy Hamlin and Kathy Hale who baked cookies to go along with the cards, and to everyone who delivered cards to the recipients.


## Movie Night Resumes!



The fourth year of the revived Spiritual Life Movie Series will begin with *Bicycle Thieves* (Ladri di Biciclette, 1948), one of the greatest movies, as film critics measure quality. The movie, set in economically depressed post-World War II Italy, is the outwardly the story of a poor man who walks in Rome with his young son in search of the his (the man's) bicycle, which he needs for his work, to feed his family, but which someone has stolen. Actually, *Bicycle Thieves* is, in the words of VideoHound's Golden Movie Retriever, "a simple story that seems to seem to contain the whole of human experience." The film, which is really about what happens during the search for the bicycle, is a haunting and profound work of art.

The screening will occur in the chapel on Friday, January 26, at 6:30 p.m. Free drinks and popcorn will be available. Childcare can be available if notice is given by Wednesday, January 24 by 12 noon by calling the church office (706-546-7553).
